	BRC Directors' meeting - 28th June, London: A meeting with Professor Rob Read (Director of Soton BRC) has now been confirmed for 12 th May, AAJ and SAW to attend. This meeting is to bring RR up to speed with Collaboration business and to seek support from him in advance of the meeting that will follow on from the BRC Directors meeting on the 28 th June. To date, Southampton has enabled the Collaboration by supporting the costs of the Secretariat but it is necessary to identify additional support from the BRCs and other NIHR Infrastructure.		
	WCRF (UK) has committed to support MJW's position on the Secretariat for the second six months of FY 2017-18 on the basis that other organisations represented on the Steering Committee will also contribute in some way to supporting the Collaboration.

	Macmillan funding call: Jane Murphy has submitted an outline application entitled "Development of a mobile app to provide diet and nutrition guidance with monitoring indicators of nutritional wellbeing for people living with and beyond cancer" to the Macmillan funding call.		
3. Phase II report	There was discussion around the precise purpose of this report. NOCRI colleagues perceived it as awareness-raising, promotional publication that reflected all of the collaboration activities (including Phase I activities) whereas the Steering		

	Committee expects the Secretariat to prepare and circulate a		
	high-level report on Phase II activities against the agenda set at the end of Phase I. JC indicated that NOCRI's role is to provide		
	support and guidance for NIHR infrastructure collaborations and to promote the NIHR infrastructure, therefore, they cannot provide funding for a report but can assist with promotional materials.		
	The two approaches are mutually beneficial but cannot be adequately expressed within a single document and so it was agreed that two documents should be published:		
	 Phase II report: detailed, high-level report, for scientific audience, also sets out Phase III objectives initially as an e-doc for circulation online only – this does not require formal approvals by NOCRI on behalf of NIHR but will not be paid for by NOCRI. Promotional leaflet: Awareness-raising progress report, brief links with Phase I. Design work and preparation of print files printing can be paid for by NOCRI.

	Where steering committee and work stream members are part of the NIHR infrastructure, they should be encouraged to discuss		

	their participation in the collaboration with their centres to explore if support can be provided to allow their participation in the collaboration and to cover travel costs for meetings. Steering Committee Chair: It was noted that AAJ's term as NIHR Director for Nutrition Research is complete and hence his responsibility as Chair of the Collaboration. The need to identify and appoint a Chair had been drawn to the attention of DHand NIHR. AAJ agreed to continue as interim Chair for the June meeting, and the need to proceed to the appointment of a Chair was noted.

5. NCRI CSG survey	Five responses have been received so far from the CSG survey. All showed an interest in nutrition-related research. Professor Richard Neal (University of Leeds) is the chair of the Primary Care CSG and is happy to take further questions.

6. Charity consortium proposal	After the workshop in February, a form was sent around to the delegates to capture information about funding opportunities and the quality assurance processes of charities for any guidance they publish. Forms were received back from 13 organisations. A summary of the quality assurance processes is underway.

	support some of the work of the body of authoritative guidance.		
7. Work stream updates	Professionals work stream: Ramsey Cutress has decided to step down as leader of the work stream due to time pressures. Jane Murphy will take over to lead and chair. RIC will still contribute to the Collaboration going forward.

	The GP survey has now received 79 responses and is now closed. Analysis to commence with input from Professionals work stream.		
	Research work stream sub groups: All three sub-groups are now up and running. Karen Brown's sub-group had their first call last week. Sam Ahmedzai's group are in the process of arranging a face to face meeting (with support from NCRI for room provision). SAW will act as a link between the sub-groups. He is a member of Karen's group and will sometimes dial in to the other teleconferences.		
	Toolkit: SAW and FD are currently working on the Toolkit and together with the work stream will produce a draft narrative document with Bernard Corfe by the end of May to be tabled at the next SC in June.		
	Sorrel Burden and Theresa Wiseman are leading on the final analysis/results section, the work stream will contribute to writing the manuscript for the survey. It is hoped that a draft document will be prepared under the direction of Bernard Corfe in time to be tabled at the next SC in June.		
8. National office for nutrition update	There are three outstanding tasks which AAJ will complete before the National Office for Nutrition Project finishes. On Friday 5 th May 2017 the Physical Activity workshop was held. There were about 20 delegates, most of which are conducting research in the field of physical activity and cancer. The delegates were very interested in carrying the work forward. A note is being prepared and will be in the public domain. The draft document that was presented to the workshop will also be available. There was strong support from the group to work collaboratively to develop a consensus that would inform future research in physical activity and would in turn, feed in to the Toolkit and Research work streams.		
	The workshops on sarcopenia/wasting/cachexia and behaviour		

change are in the process of being set up and reports will be made back to the Secretariat in due course.	
FD and SAW are continuing work on the review into what research into cancer and nutrition is funded by NIHR, exploring the detail of who, what and where. This information will form part of the discussion at the 28 th June BRC Directors meeting.
